FORMING GOOD STEWARDS

First Sunday of Lent

“When the devil had finished every temptation, he departed from him for a time.” Luke 4:1-13

Now there's a scary thought, Jesus, the Word made Flesh, Son of God and Son of Mary, is tempted by the devil – not just once, but again and again. How was Jesus really tempted? *Turn stones into bread.* That is a temptation to acquire material security and financial wealth. The Holy Land is full of stones. To do something that will amaze people so you can gain control over their minds and hearts and souls. In various ways we constantly face these same temptations in our lives. How do we deal with them? Jesus resisted them again and again. As his disciples we must do the same.

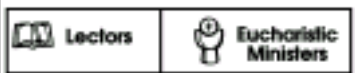
