**LENT begin February 22nd**

**What is Lent?**

It is the 40 day period in the Church year set aside for spiritual preparation for Easter. It is a time of renewal and a time of penance.

**When is Lent:**

It begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.

**Why is Lent important?**

Lent prepares you to celebrate more fully the death and Resurrection of Jesus (that is called the Pascal Mystery). For individuals and the community, it intensifies the Christian with:

**FAITH:** Christians try to strengthen and increase their faith and loyalty to Jesus through spiritual discipline and purification.


**HOPE:** Christians strive to understand more deeply the Paschal Mystery; which is Jesus' passage through death to eternal life and His promise of renewed life to those who believe.

**LOVE:** Through self-sacrifice and works of charity, Christians seek to rise above self-love and follow the spirit of Jesus' sacrifice.

**Fasting and abstinence during Lent**

**Days of Abstinence:** No meat can be eaten on Ash Wednesday and all of the Fridays during Lent. This applies to all Catholics 14 and older.

**Days of Fast:** Only one full meal is permitted on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for Catholics between 18 and 59. Two smaller meals are permitted, but the small meals should not equal a second full meal. Drinking coffee, tea and water between meals is allowed. Snacks between meals are not allowed.



## DEVELOP A JOYFUL APPROACH TO LENT



### ***Lent in our Homes....***

We have so many challenges facing our families today. Now is the perfect time to experience Lent and home is the perfect place! Home is where we rest, where we rush, where we worry, where we hope, where we love and where we forgive. Our homes are where we experience most of our day-to-day salvation. So it seems logical that Lenten experiences can take place in the rooms of our home.

**Start with the basics & keep it simple.** Focus on the practices of **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving** in your home. We all struggle to make Catholic practices happen in our homes. You are not alone. Make your Lenten efforts part of your lifestyle without lowering the bar for faith formation.

**Create a Lenten focus for your home.**

Find ways to **carve out special moments of grace** in your everyday schedule. Daily devotions don't need to last an hour.

**Select activities that fit your household.** Lenten spirituality should never feel forced or imposed. At the same time, don't be afraid to try something new.

*Here are some additional ideas to help enrich your celebration of Lent at home:*

**Make Family Mealtime something different this Lent:** Why not pick one evening a week to prepare a meal together. Assign a different dish or task to every family member. Before you begin, talk about how each family member is giving to the others—giving time, effort, and care to nourish the entire family to go out and do God's will. Begin with a prayer of thanks and petition. Dinner is a perfect opportunity to talk as a family.

**40 Questions:** Here's an idea: Place 40 questions in a basket to ask each family member during the 40 dinner meals during Lent. One per night in Lent. Things like:

- *Name the top 5 things that make you happy*
- *For children- What things about being an adult are you most looking forward to? For adults – What do you miss most about being a kid?*
- *For children - So far in your life what is the most important thing your parents have taught you? For adults – What is the most important things your children have taught you.*
- *What is the most special gift you have ever given someone?*

**Family Lenten Reading:** Prominently display the Bible, religious books or pamphlets that feature topics such as the following: Lent, forgiveness, prayer, Scripture, generosity, social justice and service for others. Invite family members to choose a book, pamphlet, bible verse and discuss what they read.

**Family Kindness and Sharing:** On slips of paper, write random acts of kindness and place in a jar. Things such as give a compliment, call an old friend, carry someone's heavy load, write a kind note to someone in your family, do 1 of your brother or sisters chores today, help your parents without being asked. Each family member takes a slip of paper as he or she leaves in the morning. They perform the kindness without seeking recognition. Afterward, talk together about what happened. Pray with one another that your kindness would be passed on thought Lent and beyond.

**Not just your ordinary giving to charities:** Ask each family member to find 3 to 5 high-quality, useful items that would be appreciated by those who are less fortunate. Donate the items to a favorite charity. Pray together for those who will receive them.

### **Lenten Promise Tree**



*Kids are very visual. Try this to help them with their Lenten promises.*

**Supplies Needed:** Coffee can, wrapping paper, glue, leafless tree branch, paper or index cards, yarn, hole punch

Decorate the outside of a coffee can with wrapping paper. Place some dirt, stones or rice in a coffee can. Set a large branch down in the can.

Each family members makes a little book from wrapping paper, cardstock paper or index cards. They write a promise to perform an act of mercy or an act of kindness to show the love of neighbor during Lent. A hole is punched in each booklet. Using yarn, tie each booklet to the tree. Each day during dinner help family members to remember their "promise".



### Stretch just a little this Lent...

God gave you so much. Let's really stretch this Lent for Him.

"...I'm giving up candy for Lent". Really? Why not stretch a little and give up **PS3** or **TV** for Lent?

"...I am going to say extra prayers all during Lent". Really? Why not go to Mass and extra day every week during Lent? Why not make it a point to go to Stations of the Cross every time it is offered?

## Forming Good Stewarts

### Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Everyone is looking for you. Mark 1:29-39

Of course everyone was looking for Jesus. He cured their sick and drove out their demons. They believed in him because of what they had seen him do. But had they listened to his message and did they believe what he had to say? Jesus would eventually tell others that "It is your faith that has healed you." In the first reading, Job recants his life of drudgery, loss and pain. The passage concluded, "I shall not see happiness again." But Job did not lose faith in God when the Lord allowed Satan to test him, so God restores Job's fortunes and gives him a beautiful family. Faith that does not endure when tested is not faith. As long as Jesus stayed in Capernaum and healed their sick and drove out demons, they believed in him. The test of their faith is whether they continued to believe in him when he left to preach the gospel to others by his words and actions. The test for us is whether we believe the faith they passed on to us.

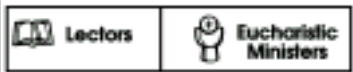
